As we study the American Civil war you are assigned to research and write a **3-5 page** paper on an important figure during the civil war, or an important battle. You are also assigned an art project inspired by your study of the civil war and in a medium you have previously studied here at the Arts Academy. **On March 21st you will present your paper (present not read) and you art for the class.**

Paper Requirements:

Must be 3-5 pages with a title page and bibliography (title page and bibliography do not count as part of the 3 - 5 pages). I expect the paper to be in **12 pt.** font size and using American Type or Times New Roman. You are required to use at least 3 sources, **2 of them must be from books** or magazines. I Strongly recommend you use Pioneer Library for all your Internet use. **Research notes and rough draft are required.**

Research notes completed and checked off by Monday the 10th (15p)

Rough Draft Friday the 17th (10 pt all or nothing on this day)

Final Draft Wednesday 20th (75 pt)

Art Requirements;

Pulling from the many visual art mediums you have worked with you are to create a civil war inspired piece in the medium of your choosing. If you are unable to decide on a medium I will choose one for you.
